Mark this one in your calendars it is not to be missed!




December Meeting — Dr. David Kirshner



From the movement of the first animals including Hyenas and Chimpanzees to the zoo through to the intricate placement of lighting for reptile enclosures this talk had a bit of everything. Key takeaways included the angled design of some enclosures to avoid glare for visitor experience as well as designing the Reptile side of the building to flow into a Nocturnal House by utilising nocturnal Reptiles and Invertebrates.

Pre-Expo Dinner — Dingo & Kirsty Dinkleman








As always, the vendors, displayers and sponsors brought along some impressive animals including this Brown Tree Snake also known as a Night Tiger (*Boiga irregularis*) at Black Snake Productions who were set up in the foyer space with an impressive static display of Australian reptiles.

There was also quite a range of different Carpet Python morphs (Morelia spilota sp.) on display at many tables including one from Radical Reptiles.





Yarra Reptiles, Copperhead Customs and Animals of Oz worked together to display an incredible Oenpelli Python (*Nyctophilopython oenpelliensis*) with an impressive background. This was a very popular display throughout the day.

Melbourne Pet Show



The Melbourne Pet Show was a massive event over two days which represented some of the many pets that people keep in their homes. There were two buildings for this event, one being filled with Cats and Dogs and the other being Small Animals including the VHS display of reptiles alongside Black Snake Productions, Minibeast Enterprises and Yarra Reptiles.

It was an incredibly busy weekend with over 15,000 people coming through the doors. It was a joy and pleasure to be involved with wildlife education and reptile pet ownership. The display was focussed on native reptiles that can be held either without a license or with a basic wildlife license to show what can be kept in the home by anyone interested in keeping reptiles.

Brisbane Reptile Expo 2023

For the first time in about 5 years, Brisbane had its very own reptile expo. Open from 10am – 3pm on both Saturday and Sunday, it was eye-opening to see what a two day event would look like. Credit to Elizabeth and her team for organising the event and to those who sponsored and supported it. The expo seemed to be a hit with over 2,000 people walking through the doors on Saturday morning.





It was great to see some incredible vendors including the likes of Joe Ball from bluetonguelizard.com.au with some incredible blue tongue morphs (*Tiliqua sp.*) and T+ Albino Cunningham Skinks (*Egernia cunninghami*) as well as Gavin Bedford with some stunning Oenpelli Pythons (*Nyctophilopython oenpelliensis*) and Albino Olive Pythons (*Liasis olivaceus*). There was some awesome animals on display at the expo including the Emerald Monitor (*Varanus prasinus*) and Biak Green Tree Python (*Morelia azureus*) from Snake Sanctum. There was also some very well put together terrariums on display by the team at Natural Ecosystems.
